Accompanying Persons

Delegates' partners who are not attending the Conference may register as accompanying persons. They will then be included in the Conference Dinner and visits.

The Historic Town of Stratford upon Avon Birthplace of William Shakespeare

Stratford-upon-Avon is an English town with more than 800 years of history, containing many old timber-framed buildings that survive today, and which would have been familiar to Shakespeare himself. For example, the conference hotel incorporates a 16th century Tudor building with modern extensions at the rear, including a conference centre.

Stratford is an active community offering a wide variety of leisure and shopping.

A visit to Stratford enables you to discover more about the poet and playwright, William Shakespeare who was born in Stratford and whose childhood house has been preserved. Do not miss a visit to Shakespeare's birthplace.

Other Shakespeare locations include Halls Croft (home to William's daughter), the home of Shakespeare's wife, Ann Hathaway, and Mary Arden's Farm (the childhood home of Shakespeare's mother).

The Royal Shakespeare Theatre, which specialises in Shakespeare's works, is a short distance from the hotel.
